#### **GUEST SPEAKER:**

The guest speaker was Randall Garrison-NDP MP for Esquimalt-Saanich-Sooke and Critic for National Defense and LGBTQ2 issues

Highlights;

- Thanked labour council and trade unions for their support!
- A federal election could be called next spring
- Nov 17 is his nomination meeting for the next campaign at Royal Oak Neighbourhood House,
  4525 West Saanich Rd
- He is going to the UN in 10 days
- Pot is the topic of the day. He plans to decline to answer any questions about smoking pot.
- Criminal Records; NDP is working on expungement while Liberals only working on pardons which can still impede someone from getting a job
- He is working on getting the term 'self-harm' removed from the Canadian Armed Forces/National Defence Act regulations as keeping it in as a disciplinary offense is actually a barrier to getting help. Included in Bill C-77 amendments. Suicide attempts are considered self-harm. There is 1 suicide per month. Conservatives support the amendment. Waiting to see if Liberals will.
- As the LGBTQ2 critic, he reported that there were ~2000 people kicked out of the military and they received a dishonorable discharge. He is working to ensure they receive an honorable discharge instead so they can received benefits such as a pension.
- Working on changing the 1-year blood ban for gay people. It was 5 years. The Liberals promised to eliminate the ban.
- A pension's bill, Bill C-27 is being proposed. Employers would be allowed take a 'defined benefit pension plan' and change it into a 'target benefit plan'. This equates to the employee only getting out what they put into the plan.

- CLC rep Orion Irvine;
  - Proportional Representation Rally on Tues. Oct 23<sup>rd</sup>.
  - He encouraged everyone to vote in the municipal election
  - He spoke about tariffs and trade agreements then asked Randall Garrison to update us further on these issues.
    - Randall said 'Check your milk' as we are now allowing United States dairy products into Canada but they do not have the same regulations/restrictions as we do in Canada.
    - There are some issues with the TPP, Trans-Pacific Partnership as Canada could end up paying when a business feels as if it has lost opportunities. It just passed third reading in parliament.

- Queen Alexandra Hospital Union;
  - Shortages of funds for early intervention for children
    - Won a 6 year long grievance over parking issue
  - CUPW;
    - Rotating strike notice given Oct. 17<sup>th</sup>, 2018 means they could be on strike as early as Mon. Oct 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2018
    - Will be needing local union support
  - Board of Governors?? meeting will be at the Victoria International Airport on Tues, Oct 23, 2018
    - Looking for union/community members for support by attending this meeting
    - Compass Group wants to lower minimum wages of Local 40 members

## United Way Report;
