RE: THE MONTREAL MASSACRE MEMORIAL - DECEMBER 6th

December 6th marks the 31st anniversary of the Montreal Massacre. Each year, PSAC's Vancouver Island Regional Women's Committee (VIRWC) organizes a December 6th Memorial.

As union women, we are proud of our work to ensure we remember the 14 murdered women, raise awareness of violence against women and fundraise for organizations who provide safe havens for women and children in need of protection.

This year, we are **collecting donations for the Victoria Transition House and the Victoria Sexual Assault Center**. All monies raised will be divided between organizations. We are asking you and your union to financially support women and children in our communities so they do not have to live in fear.

Each year unions generously donate; but this year *we ask that your Local reach a little deeper*.

COVID-19 has created financial stress on families and women have bore the economic brunt of job losses; 1.5 million Canadian women lost their jobs in the first 2 months of the pandemic. Providing financial support provides a way out of domestic violence.

PSAC BC Region and the VIRWC are holding a virtual event remembering the 14 women who were murdered during the Montreal Massacre on **Sunday, December 6, 2019 at 5:10 pm**. Hello College Locals

The University group of Locals is planning a campaign informed by the attached Post Secondary Education recovery discussion document. The reality is there are sector wide challenges and a sector wide campaign will be a more effective than a university only campaign. With that understanding, the consensus within the University group is to invite all CUPE College Locals in BC to participate in the campaign. To support this, I am sharing the discussion document and *draft* cost share in advance of organizing a meeting to discuss and consider joining this campaign. You'll note that the language of the *draft* cost share already includes references to colleges due to the reality that all of Post Sec is affected similarly and collective action is best.

The original estimate of cost sharing is based on \$10.00 per member with a kick off early in the New Year.
